





Ho Chi Minh




- Communist leader in North Vietnam
- Started the Viet Minh the communist party of North Vietnam
- Studied tactics of Mao
- Seize land & redistribute to peasants
- Use guerilla tactics by using Viet Cong: communist living in South Vietnam

Ho Chi Minh



- Won support of the Peasants
- "Robin Hood" figure
- Troop behavior:
- No damage to crops
- No damage to belongings
- Buy or borrow supplies
- Do not steal from locals
- Help with daily work

South Vietnam President Diem




- US backed leader in South
- 1955 1963
- Opposite of Ho Chi Minh:
- People didn't like him
- Unrest & protest
- A Catholic that persecuted Buddhists
- 85% of South were Buddhist

South Vietnam President Diem




- Persecution of Buddhists lead to several public suicides
- Treatment of Buddhists and other policies lead to Diem's assassination in 1963








US troops get involved




- 1964 US Navy was attacked in the Gulf of Tonkin in Northern Vietnam
- President Johnson asks US Congress for permission to wage war against North Vietnam
- Johnson sends ground troops into South Vietnam

Viet Cong & Ho Chi Minh trail




- Viet Cong were South Vietnamese communists that were controlled by the North
- Hid among South Vietnamese
- Used guerilla tactics
- Ho Chi Minh trail :
- soldiers, supplies from
 North to South through
 Laos & Cambodia


Viet Cong Guerilla Tactics



- Hide in tunnel complexes in villages
- Street bombings
- Hide with civilians & peasants
- Booby traps
- Ambush in jungles









Viet Cong Booby Trap

1992.34.1

This type of booby trap was placed just under the surface of water in rice paddies and wetlands. The Coke can hid the spike which connected to a grenade below the concrete block. When stepped on, the spike penetrated the boot and foot. Jerking the foot up would detonate the explosive. Cpl Paul Marquis discovered and disarmed this device before it could do any damage.









US responds to jungle war



- US sprays chemical defoliants
- Agent Orange
- Kill trees and bushes
- Less places for Viet Cong to hide
- Birth defects for Vietnamese children & diseases among soldiers

Tet Offensive



- Surprise attack by North
- Jan 31 1968
- Violated 2 day truce that celebrated Tet : lunar new year
- 70,000 North Vietnamese & Viet Cong attack 100 cities & towns
- Used Ho Chi Minh trail to prepare for attacks

Tet Offensive



- Attack by the North turned into a defeat for the North
- North lost 50,000 troops
- South lost 6,000 troops
- Psychological victory for North
- Proved they could attack anywhere in South
- Even at the US Embassy in Saigon

Opinions about Vietnam War begin to change at home

- The first war to be seen on TV every night
- The first war to be seen in photos in daily and weekly newspapers and magazines
- Protests begin at home








- North uses Fonda as propaganda to demoralize US soldiers fighting in Vietnam

- 70,000 fled to Canada to escape the war



Vietnamization

- US Troops withdraw slowly
- Hand over control to South Vietnam
- Paris Peace treaty between North & South January 27, 1973
- Last US troops leave March 29, 1973
- Full scale war begins again in 1975 as North Vietnam takes over all of Vietnam
- Saigon falls & name changes to Ho Chi Minh City

Christmas 1972 a cease-fire was agreed between the USA and the North


November 1968 LB Johnson lost the US election to Richard Nixon.
